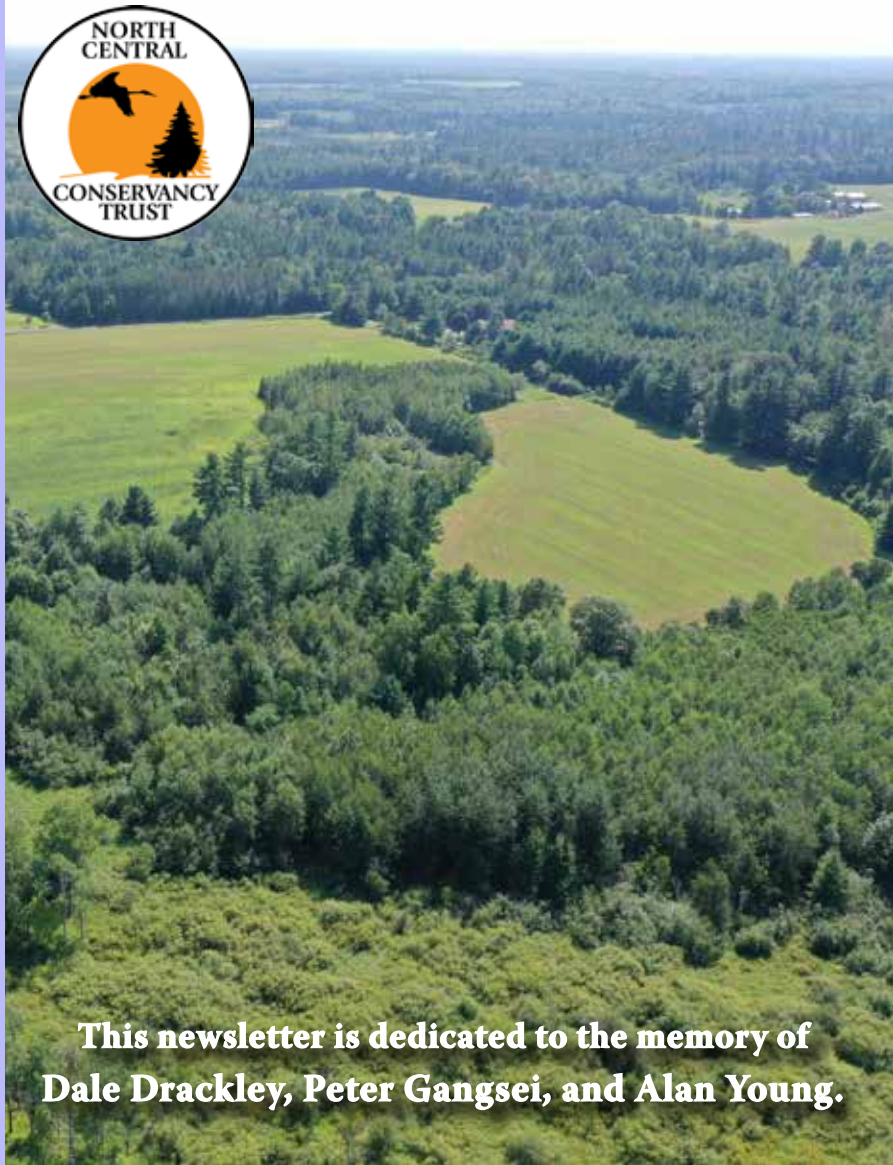

FROM THE EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR

NCCT has accomplished a lot in its 32 years; permanently protecting over 5,300 acres in our eight-county service area, owning and managing four nature preserves, employing three permanent staff, hosting a solid internship program, and more than 100 volunteers and supporters are helping each year with easement monitoring, preserve management, Board & Committee service, hosting events, and collectively working together to protect land and natural resources today, so that they can be preserved long into the future.



NCCT is an organization that thinks long term, very long term. Our primary tool for doing this important work is with permanent conservation easements. These land protection agreements are established by landowners and the land trust working together to protect the conservation values of these special places, and they require a long term commitment from the Land Trust to ensure the agreements are upheld.

To serve this purpose and to continue to protect precious natural resources long into the future, we have established several mechanisms to build financial stability and resiliency. For example, NCCT is able to accept gifts of land, stock, and other potentially valuable assets. We have also established endowment funds at the Community Foundation in Stevens Point and at the Community Foundation in Wausau. These are long-term investments in NCCT and are options we hope you might consider as you think about your own conservation legacy.

More information can be found on our website, but we are also just a phone call away and would look forward to talking more about the many options available to you. Thank you so much for your ongoing support for NCCT and for helping to protect Wisconsin's natural beauty and precious ecosystems.

2025 BY THE NUMBERS

What an incredible year 2025 was for NCCT!

Thanks to your support, we protected 90 additional acres through one conservation easement and one land donation. NCCT now protects 63 conservation easement properties and owns five properties, four of which are Nature Preserves.

Due to your continued support, NCCT welcomed a new full-time staff member, bringing the team to 3 full-time staff, the largest in NCCT history! NCCT also hosted a Spring intern, providing valuable hands-on experience for the next generation of conservationists. This increased capacity allows NCCT to be more effective in protecting our vital natural resources.

Your generosity fuels the future of conservation in north central Wisconsin. NCCT has several new land protection projects underway, with growing interest from local landowners to conserve their corner of Central Wisconsin. These complex projects require ample time and resources from volunteers, staff, and legal expertise, made possible through your support.

Last year's success is a direct result of your dedication to long-term conservation. Your generosity has allowed NCCT to thrive and turn our mission into real, lasting conservation successes. Thank you for helping to permanently protect land in Central Wisconsin.

Peter Gangsei Conservation Easement

Thanks to the generosity of Peter Gangsei, 60 additional acres of land are now permanently protected in Portage County. Mr. Gangsei, who passed away in July 2025, included NCCT in his estate plans, providing

guidance to his estate, along with the funds needed, to place a conservation easement on his property. Just days before Christmas last year, NCCT formally accepted the Gangsei Conservation Easement. Once used as an agricultural pasture, the property has since regenerated into a mature forest and serves as a vital standalone patch of natural habitat surrounded by agriculture and industrial use. The property is near the Tomorrow River State Trail and is less than one mile from Standing Rocks County Park. NCCT truly appreciates being able to honor Peter's wishes and his legacy through this permanent land protection agreement.

Dolores Kromka Conservation Easement

In February 2026, NCCT protected an additional 40 acres in Portage County. The Kromka Conservation Easement features working farmlands, as well as wetlands and forested lands. The property includes features that protect and facilitate wetland functions and therefore protect natural water movements and the associated habitat, which are a vital component of our ecosystem. With this property under the protection of a conservation easement, the diverse plants, wildlife, and landscapes will be shielded from development.



Easement donor, Dolores Kromka, stated, "In as much as my immigrant family acquired this virgin land in 1908 and nurtured it to fulfill their needs, I wish to perpetuate this legacy for future generations. I cherish this property and wish to have it preserved to serve others."

ANNUAL FUND HIGHLIGHTS

The Green Bay Packers Foundation

NCCT received a \$3,000 grant from the Green Bay Packers Foundation to purchase a new drone and support ongoing restoration projects at NCCT's Suszko Ridge Nature Preserve! A new drone will increase NCCT's ability to safely and effectively monitor conservation easements, help NCCT survey prospective conservation easements and our Nature Preserves, and improve our outreach efforts.

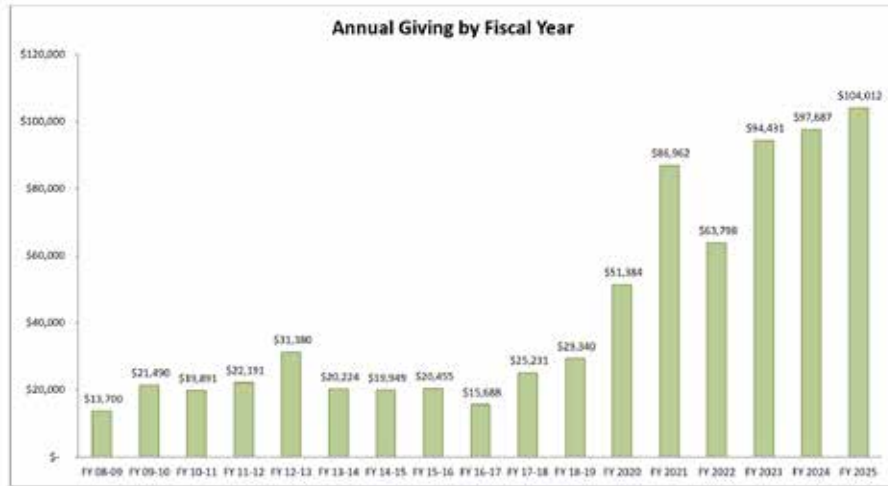

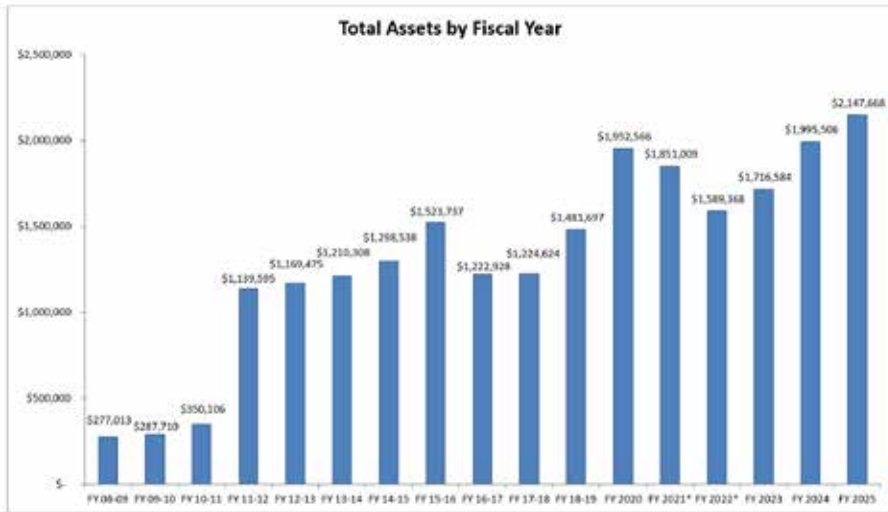

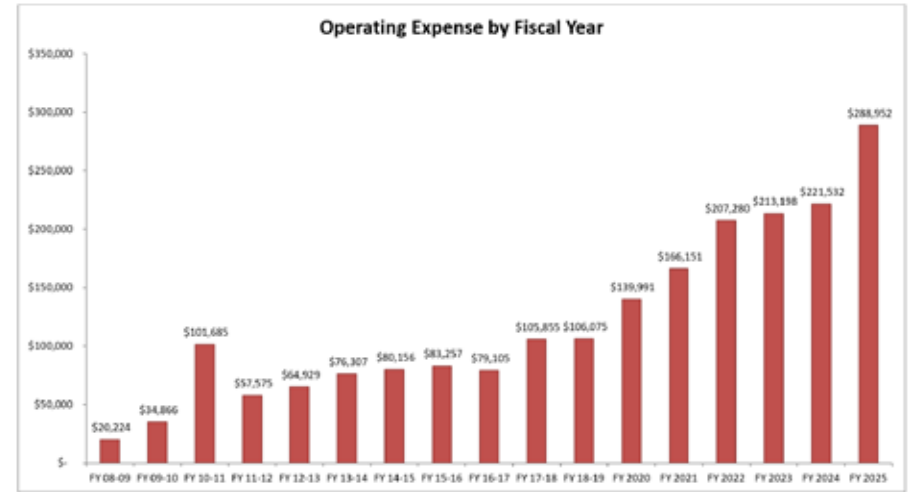
2025 ANNUAL REPORT



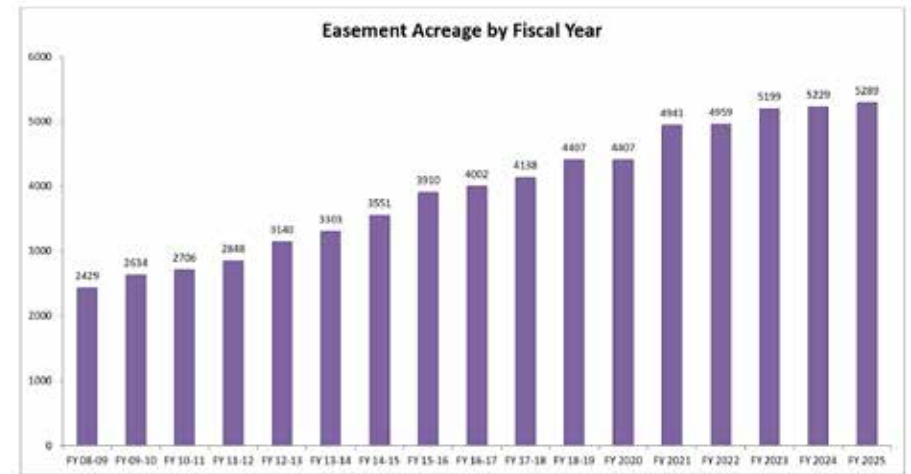
Note: FY 2020 - FY 2025 were significantly higher than previous years due to increased membership and increased generosity from NCCT members and supporters. This graph does not include grant awards, which amounted to an additional \$47,500.



Note: Significant changes in assets in some fiscal years is primarily due to land gifts, purchases, and sales. FY 2021 and FY 2022 ended with significant negative returns from NCCT's investments, contributing to a loss in total assets during that period. FY 2023, FY 2024, and FY 2025 ended with a net income due to increases in support from the public, grants & foundations, as well as positive returns from investments. Also in FY 2025, the Big Cain Creek Preserve was donated to NCCT.



Note: The jump in expenses for FY 10-11 was due to shifting funds from a property sale to fund the endowment fund at the Community Foundation of North Central Wisconsin. The jump in expenses from FY 2024 to FY 2025 was due to increased staffing, and increased easement & property related expenses.

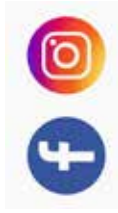
